



The Colts Youth Organization was honored in 2023 to receive a \$10,000 grant from the Dubuque Racing Association.

The grant was used to help upgrade the Colts Electronics System.

Since 1985, the Dubuque Racing Association has awarded over \$400,000 to the Colts — for everything from instruments and uniforms to vehicles and trailers to, literally, the roof over our heads.

### 1968 Colts Color Guard

The 1960s were a challenging time for the Colts (then named the Legionnaires). The corps was formed in 1963 and for the first four summers was exclusively a parade corps. Membership was not growing and many members were frustrated with the limited performance opportunities and by the end of the summer of 1967 were considering walking away from the corps. The members who would ultimately lead and inspire the 1968 color guard decided to stay and were instrumental in keeping the corps alive. By the fall of that year, the Board of Directors hired three instructors to work with the corps - one to work with percussion, one with the brass, and the third to work with the guard and design the first field show for the Legionnaires.

This kept the members together for the season, and the subsequent leadership and success of the 1968 color guard gave all members the impetus to stay beyond that season. In the next four years, the guard led the corps to six state championships and cemented the direction of the Legionnaires, Colt .45, and the Colts for the years to come. Without this success the Colts Youth Organization may have been one of the more than 400 corps that are no longer active and are only distant memories to those who lived during that incredible time in drum corps history.

Although no one at that time realized what that championship meant to the Colts organization, without it the last 60 years of education and success would never have taken place. Numerous alumni from that decade have noted the vital role that the '68 guard played. We therefore have immense pride in honoring the members of the 1968 Legionnaires color guard and welcoming them as a group to the Colts Hall of Fame.

### Geri (Osthoff) Nederhoff

Geri has been part of the Colts "family" for over 40 years, beginning as an exemplary member of the Colts from 1972 to 1978. Those years were an important period for the corps, as the Colts transitioned from one of many lowa corps competing on a regional level to reaching national prominence and excellence. Geri has always been known for her infectious positive attitude that spills over to others around her. Virtually every member she marched with comments that she led by example in everything that she did. The enthusiasm she demonstrated as a member continues to this day, adding to the Colts' continued success as a youth organization.

During her seven seasons marching with the Colts she was named Colts Horn Player of the Year in 1977 and selected as a baritone soloist in elite ensembles that included other Colts Hall of Fame members. After aging out she continued to support the corps, working as a volunteer anytime the corps was close to her home in the Boston area, being a dedicated cook truck volunteer and a regular donor to the corps. She has been an advocate for drum corps in general and the Colts specifically, and like many other members has maintained lifelong friendships with those she marched with, helping to keep them engaged in the corps. She has introduced drum corps to dozens of friends by taking them to local shows and describing her experience in the Colts.

Geri retired in 2021 after spending 23 years as Co-Director of Admissions at the Harvard Graduate School of Design. She joined the Colts Booster Board, where she now serves as President and represents the boosters on the Colts Corporate Board. Most recently, she has worked with Bill Symoniak to recruit and organize volunteers, and now leads that effort as Volunteer Coordinator. Geri's years marching with the Colts, her accomplishments as a musician, her commitment to the organization, and her enthusiasm and positive attitude been invaluable contributions to the Colts. Lauren spent twelve years with the Colts — marching in the cymbal line for three years (1998-2000) and teaching the cymbal line for nine years (2001-2009). As a performing member (1999), and as an instructor

(2005), Lauren helped lead the Colts cymbal line to two DCI I&E Championship cymbal ensembles as well as multiple second place finishes in other seasons. More than anything, she instilled a competitive mindset in her performers and never let them settle for anything less than excellence. Many of her students (including current Colts visual caption head Jack Borland) have themselves moved into teaching roles, both with the Colts and other DCI corps. Lauren's teaching career also includes stints teaching at Gateway Indoor Percussion and the Crossmen.

Lauren is also a visual artist who contributed to the Colts in a very unique way - she designed the Colts triangle logo. Her design appears on nearly every item owned or produced by the corps - from letterhead to vehicles, to our corps hall, to websites, to stadium scoreboard displays, to souvie merchandise. The logo is a part of the corps signature and worn as a tattoo by many. Lauren never asked for payment for the design. She contributed her incredible artistic talents to the place she loves, without a thought of compensation. In a time when things change guickly and often, the Colts triangle logo is unmistakable in the world of DCI.

Lauren serves as an art teacher and Fine Arts Department Chair at Lafayette High School in Wildwood, Missouri, where she is completing her 23rd year. A gifted educator, she has been recognized as the Teacher of the Year in a school district of 30 schools and 20,000+ students. She recently returned to the Colts organization and now serves on the Boosters Board of Directors.

Lauren is a world champion and has taught world champions. Lauren's students have taught world champions in both DCI and WGI Percussion. Lauren gave her all to the Colts for 12 years. Her commitment to the corps, the number of corps members and staff that she positively impacted, and the excellence she displayed as both a member and staff member, make Lauren unquestionably worthy of induction into the Colts Hall of Fame.

### **Chris Tomsa**

Chris joined the Colts staff a year after Carla and continued in a variety of roles from 2004 to 2016. The first summer Chris was with the Colts, he was a member of the brass staff. The next year, he took over as brass arranger - a role he would hold for over a decade. During that time the Colts became known for their beautiful, lyrical ballads with Chris writing the charts. He arranged many memorable moments in the Colts 2007 production, "Equinox," when the corps would go on to finish 10th at DCI Championships. Chris later spent two years as program coordinator and played a crucial role as assistant corps director from 2014 to 2016, helping the current administration find its footing during their early years.

He marched seven years, never aging out. However, he continued to grow in the activity and over the years corps including Boston Crusaders, North Star, 27th Lancers, Garfield Cadets, Glassmen, Connexion Quebec, and now the Colts and Colt Cadets all benefitted from his talents as an instructor.

Tom's tenure with the Colts began in 2004 and has continues to the present day — some 20 years later. His institutional knowledge, sagaciousness, and calming demeanor have had an enduring impact on both students and staff alike, not only within our organization, but everyone whom he has associated. Tom's mantra of "lifelong learning" epitomizes his philosophy and approach in teaching. By his own admission, Tom was not the best player. He reached the top of our activity by being organized, patient, positive, receptive to constructive criticism, and possessing a strong work ethic.

Tom initially pursued a career in journalism but found his passion in music and education, recently retiring after 32 years as a music educator in Maine. He continues to teach seminars throughout the Northeast; is a sought-after adjudicator and continues his passion of drum corps His influence has been recognized by being inducted into the Boston Crusaders, Massachusetts Drum Corps, and Maine Music Educators Halls of Fame.

Tom is committed to treating every young member with respect and makes sure that each has the maximum opportunity to grow and thrive in our organization. It is with great pleasure that we honor TL's commitment to the Red Team and induct him into the Colts Hall of Fame.





### Bill & Luba Symoniak

Bill and Luba's oldest son, Kyle, brought the family to Dubuque from the Twin Cities in 2001 with a desire to march drum corps. Bill and Luba jumped in as hard-working and willing volunteers from the get-go. You name it; they were willing to take it on.

Bill joined the Colts Board of Directors in 2004 and served until 2022. He was Board Secretary for most of those years. Separate from his Board duties. he became volunteer coordinator in 2003 - a role he filled until 2023. He was often the first to welcome new volunteers. and the first to find them and sign them up to help. He spent countless hours organizing the cook truck and food supplies, rotating stock, and finding that one box that the head cook just had to have right now. His service was recognized throughout the activity when he was named a Drum Corps International Volunteer of the Year in 2017

Luba was right alongside Bill the whole time. She cooked, sewed, checked-in campers, organized souvenirs, helped with office work, and did whatever else needed to be done that no one else was doing.

Luba was the best at stepping in where she was needed most. Whether it was cooking, sewing, organizing souvies, laundry or a myriad of other tasks, she moved effortlessly to where the next need existed. She stepped up to be head cook once in an emergency and continued to serve for more years than we can count, including multiple weeks many summers. They both helped with the development of an up-to-date volunteer handbook so that volunteers know what to expect on the road.

Bill was one of the key people that created the Colts Virtual Cooktruck blog from its inception in 2004 keeping volunteers and parents abreast of what was happening every day during tour. They were also exceptional at knowing which of the members didn't have a ride to camp and either arranging one or swinging by (sometimes an hour out of their way) on the way to camp to pick someone up.

They did all this without a thought for themselves. Their focus was always the corps members and for each corps member as an individual, not just a kid in a uniform. We are honored to induct them into the Colts Hall of Fame Class of 2024.
